Class Entry Fees: \$26.00 per halter class (double show), \$24.00 per novice or advanced performance class (double show), each bagged or fleece-on entry is \$14 (\$19 at the show), youth performance classes are each \$14.00 (double show), youth showmanship is \$10.00 (double show), and youth costume class is \$5.

ILR Fee: There is a \$6 fee for each llama participating in halter and performance classes (double shows) and \$3 fee for each llama participating in fiber classes (single show) – if the same animal is shown in fiber and halter, or fiber and performance, or all three, the fee is just \$6. This fee applies to all exhibitors. Finished products and skeins of yarn do not pay a \$3.00 fee! If you enter online, Show Manager cannot handle both a single show (fleece) and a double show (halter and performance) – this means your per animal fees shown by ShowManager are likely to be wrong.

Sharing Performance Animals: Animals may show in ONE Performance Division. Youth showing an animal in the Youth Division may NOT show the same animal in the Novice or Advanced Division, but the youth may compete in Novice or Advanced (with enough wins in Novice) performance classes with a different llama.

Stall Fees: \$19.00 per stall per day (limit of two adult llamas or three juveniles per pen). Saturday stall fee includes those arriving Friday – plan to arrive after 2:30 pm. Departures are allowed after 5pm Saturday evening and Sunday after 4pm. If you are staying the whole weekend, stalls are \$36. Please remember that all animals brought to the Event Center grounds must be placed in pens. The Event Center does not allow livestock to be housed in trailers. In addition, any animals brought on premises must be entered in the llama show.

Entry Deadline: Entries must be postmarked or entered in Show Manager (see the ILR Website), by **October 5th**, 2022 to be included in the show program. Entries received with a postmark after October 5th, 2022 will be charged a \$10.00 late fee per class.

Health Requirements: The show does not require a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection; those traveling across state lines to reach the show should be aware of requirements of the jurisdictions through which you will pass.

Not your llama? If you are showing a llama that you do not own, please include written permission from the animal's owner to show that animal.

Awards: Rosette ribbons will be awarded to first and second place in each class and Grand and Reserve Champions for each performance and halter division. Third, fourth and fifth place in each class will receive a flat ribbon. Flat ribbons will be awarded for skeins and finished goods.

Arrival and Departure: Llamas may check-in between 2:30pm and 9pm Friday (PLEASE DO NOT ARRIVE EARLY WITHOUT MAKING SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS WITH THE SUPERINTENDENT) or 5pm – 7pm Saturday evening for Sunday classes. Stalls **must be clean** (that is, all bedding and poo removed) when you depart.

Special needs competitors: Show management is happy to offer special needs classes to individuals that have worked/practiced on a regular basis and have developed a rapport with their llama. Many llamas are intuitive about the needs of their handler but this develops over time with repeated practice. To enter a performance class, please e-mail Hal the details by the registration deadline (10/5) and enter the appropriate class on Show Manager. Due to liability issues and time constraints, we cannot have any spur of the minute demonstrations or entries of this nature. Thank you for your understanding!

2022 OFF SHOW RULES

HALTER CLASSES

- ❖ All llamas shall be present for judging with a halter and lead rope with no additional decorations-halters shall not have tassels, pompoms or other removable decorations.
- ❖ No ranch, personal, animal, or organizational name, logo or insignia shall be displayed on the exhibitor or animal during the class.
- ❖ Nursing llamas cannot be accompanied in the ring by their babies. Show management recommends not showing nursing mothers.
- ❖ The Judge may dismiss animals exhibiting unruly or unsafe behavior from the ring. Dismissal can take place even before the animal enters the ring if show personnel bring the matter to the Judge's attention.
- ❖ Show management may dismiss an exhibitor and their animal from any class or participation at the show if the exhibitor mistreats their animal.
- ❖ Llamas may not be moved from one class to another after halter judging has begun, except at the Judge's discretion.
- ❖ Youth between the ages of 8 through 18 may show intact males. It is recommended that youth under 8 years of age not show intact males and youth between the ages of 7 to 12 years not show intact males over 18 months of age.
- ❖ Handler attire should be conservative, neat and appropriate for the class. Shoes should be appropriate for the show ring (open toed shoes, sandals and bare feet will disqualify the exhibitor). Suggested attire is dark pants or skirt and white shirt or blouse.
- ❖ Exhibitors shall not knowingly exhibit animals in any class, which, in their opinion, exhibit unsoundness.
- ❖ Exhibitors are responsible for following the progress of the show and shall be at ringside ten minutes before their class is called.
- ❖ An exhibitor shall not knowingly show where there is a conflict of interest with the Judge. The burden of responsibility is with the owner, exhibitor or trainer to recognize a conflict of interest.

PERFORMANCE CLASSES

- ❖ Llamas are to be entered in the division for which they are eligible at the time of the show. It is the owner's responsibility to determine if their llama has earned enough points to move the llama to a higher division. The **2022 ILR Guidelines** spell this out on page 18, #6a.

- ❖ Halter class rules also apply.
- ❖ Classes are open to any llama five months of age or over, except if otherwise specified in the class requirements.
- ❖ Alpacas may be entered and compete in performance and showmanship classes with the llamas.
- ❖ A llama may be entered in only one performance division. It is the exhibitors' responsibility to enter the correct division.
- ❖ Llamas must make an attempt at each obstacle, otherwise it will be counted as "off course."
- ❖ In the novice and advanced classes, llamas must make only one attempt at each obstacle. If obstacle is not completed, they will be judged accordingly and then go on to the next obstacle.
- ❖ A llama or handler going off-course cannot place over an animal that completed the course.
- ❖ Coaching from the sidelines by spectators is strongly discouraged and may compromise the exhibitor's scoring or result in the exhibitor's disqualification.
- ❖ After refusals at three obstacles, it will then be mandatory for the Judge to dismiss the exhibitor from the course. This procedure is not to be used in Youth classes without prior agreement of show management and explanation to the exhibitors.
- ❖ In obstacle classes, it is at the Judge's discretion whether the handler must negotiate the obstacles.
- ❖ Only voice and hand commands may be used in exhibiting animals.
- ❖ No written notes may be used in performance classes.
- ❖ Exhibitors may request the Judge provide a review of their individual score cards. Scorecards may not be reviewed without the permission of the Judge. All score sheets should remain the property of the Judge and only interpreted by the Judge with exhibitors on an individual basis.

SHOW SUGGESTIONS

- ❖ Both handler and animal should be neatly groomed and attired. Remember to not be wearing a shirt that advertises your farm when you enter the show ring.
- ❖ When in the show ring, do not talk with ring personnel or other handlers unless required.
- ❖ Concentrate on showing your animal to its best ability.
- ❖ Your animal can be more easily evaluated if it leads well and stands quietly.
- ❖ Encourage your animal to defecate before entering the ring. Did someone say something about an automatic ten-point deduction...???
- ❖ Watch closely for instructions from the Ring Steward or Judge.
- ❖ Be ready to show your animal's number to the Ring Steward or Judge when necessary.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

HALTER CLASSES

Age Division Descriptions:

Juvenile: 5 months up to less than 12 months. Yearling: 12 to less than 24 months. Two-Year old: 24 months to less than 36 months, Mature: 36 months and older

NOTE: On a llama's birthday, the llama moves up to the next older class

Non-Breeding Llamas:

These classes are for geldings, vasectomized males, and spayed or non-reproductive females. There are no sex or wool divisions.

Rule: a registration or veterinarian certificate verifying status must accompany these llamas.

Age Divisions: same as other halter classes but no juvenile class is available.

Bred and Owned:

Each entry must be an animal that was bred and raised by the owner. Owners may enter more than one animal in the class if they wish. **Rules:** The animal(s) entered must have shown in its correct halter class earlier in the day.

Production Pair:

Each entry must include two offspring by the same sire or the same dam. All animals included in the Pair must first be shown in their appropriate halter class age division. While the entry is in the sire or dam's name, and awards recognize the parent, the parent is not shown in the class. **Rules:** The two animals that comprise the Pair may be decided after halter classes but must be listed with the clerk before this class is held. If the Exhibitor(s) is (are) not the sire or dam's owner, they must have written permission of the sire or dam's owner to enter the animal in this class.

PERFORMANCE CLASSES:

Obstacle, Public Relations and Pack Classes

The purpose of these classes is to demonstrate the well-trained animal's obedience and willingness to complete the activities requested by the handler.

YOUTH CLASSES:

Age Categories (youth's age is based on their age on 1/1/2021 except youth whose 7th birthday occurred between 2 January 2021 and 25 September 2021). See https://secure.lamaregistry.com/downloads/ShowDivision/ILR-SD_GN010_Guidelines.pdf, pages 85-86.

Junior includes ages 7 years through 11 years, Intermediate includes ages 12 years through 14 years, and Senior includes ages 15 years through 19 years.

If you use ILR's ShowManager to enter the show, please note that the ages in the class descriptions for intermediates and seniors have been wrong and I don't know if they have been fixed. Use the age breaks shown above to determine if the youth is an intermediate or a senior and then ignore the ages provided in ShowManager.

Showmanship Classes:

A Showmanship class is a demonstration of the handler's ability to show his/her animal to its best advantage at halter. Judging is based on the exhibitor's basic skills in fitting, grooming, following directions, and style of presenting the animal to the Judge for evaluation. Handler's attire should be neat, clean, and appropriate for the class.

Youth Costume Class:

This is a non-ILR class where the llama, and typically the handler, are dressed in costume. Recognizing that most llamas do not like things touching their head and legs, the handler earns "extra points" for having a costume that requires the llama to accept decorations/costume parts that cover or touch these areas.

FLEECE COMPETITIONS:

Find details in the Word document at www.KoenigLlamas.com/OFFF.asp. This has information about the different types of fleeces as well as guidelines for getting the fleece ready for judging. Use the "Fleece Entry Form" to enter fleece- and coat-on classes as well as shorn fleeces. An OFFF Entry Tag should be completed and attached to the fleece bag upon arrival and OFFF Claim Tag retained for fleece return process. The fiber class numbers are at the top of page 5. NOTE: Shorn fleeces, skeins, and finished goods must be delivered to the Cascade Livestock Pavilion by 4pm on Friday (10/14) for judging.

Shorn fleeces will remain in a **restricted fleece display area** until released to exhibitor on Sunday afternoon using the matching Claim Tag. Show management is **not joking** - access to this area will be **restricted** to show personnel only. If you have questions, please **contact Peggy Gresham** at **llamacollection@msn.com**

OFFF VERSATILITY AWARD

OFFF is an event that showcases livestock and their uses. Because of this, we have created an award that honors the “all around” llama. The 2022 Llama Versatility award is sponsored by Koenig’s Wool & Fir Farm and JNK Llama Farm. Koenig’s Llamas are not competing for this award.

To be eligible, llamas must be entered in:

- ❖ The animal’s appropriate halter class for their fiber type.
- ❖ One fiber class (this may be either fleece-on or shorn/bagged fleece). If the animal is entered in both, we will take the class with the higher point total.
- ❖ At least one performance class (Obstacle, PR, Pack). Animals that enter a performance class and a driving class will get an automatic one-point bonus if they finish first in the driving division.

Points will be tabulated using the ILR point chart. This includes points for grands and reserves in fleece, halter and performance.
